Secure website

The <u>secure website</u> gives teachers access to past papers and marking schemes ahead of their publication on the public website as well as access to other resources such as the NEA standardising videos.

For teachers to access the secure website, they will need a username and password, which can be set up by their Examinations Officer.





3. Marking Schemes



Marking schemes are available to accompany question papers from past examination series, providing instructions on how to apply the marking criteria, examples of indicative content, and assessment grids articulating the banded descriptors for different levels of responses.

Then use the dropdown menus to choose the marking schemes that you are looking for:






4. Examiners' Reports

They are published on Results day for each series and are available on the <u>subject webpage</u> under <u>Resources > Key Documents</u>.









5. Online Exam Review (Marked Exemplar)








7. CPD Materials/Professional Learning

Exam Results Analysis



Exam Results Analysis can be used by teachers to:

- Evaluate their own performance against specification norms.
- Identify strengths and weaknesses for a candidate cohort and suggest areas of improvement.
- Assist individual candidates in improving their own performance.

It can be accessed on the <u>secure website</u> which allows you to compare your students' performance on each question with that of the candidature overall, letting you see where they have done well and where there might be room for improvement. To do this, under the 'Results' tab, click on 'View/Print Item Level Data' or 'View/Print Centre Performance' for comparable data.






Online CPD offers guidance for teachers assessing the WJEC GCE English Language – Non-Exam Assessment. The webinar covers a range of important things including:
