Subject webpage

Secure website




1. Key Documents


The documents are arranged in categories, and the documents in each category can be viewed by clicking the downward arrow alongside the category name.





3. Marking Schemes



Marking schemes are available to accompany question papers from past examination series, providing instructions on how to apply the marking criteria, examples of indicative content, and assessment grids articulating the banded descriptors for different levels of responses.

Then use the dropdown menus to choose the marking schemes that you are looking for:






4. Examiners' Reports

They are published on Results day for each series and are available on the <u>subject webpage</u> under <u>Key Documents > Examiner's Reports.</u>








5. Online Exam Review (Marked Exemplar)





<u>Exam Review</u> website and are made available shortly after results are issued for each series.










7. CPD/ Professional Learning Materials





Exam Results Analysis can be used by teachers to:

- Evaluate their own performance against specification norms.
- Identify strengths and weaknesses for a candidate cohort and suggest areas of improvement.
- Assist individual candidates in improving their own performance.

It can be accessed on the <u>secure website</u> allows you to compare your students' performance on each question with that of the candidature overall, letting you see where they have done well and where there might be room for improvement. To do this, under the 'Results' tab, click on 'View/Print Item Level Data' or 'View/Print Centre Performance' for comparable data.







13. Non-Examination Assessment






Non-Examination Assessment - Guidance Documents
